APPROACHING THE THRONE OF GRACE? By Mark Legendre

- I. INTRODUCTION:
 - A. In <u>Hebrews 4:14-16</u>, we read some encouraging words about the fact that Jesus Christ is our "<u>high priest</u>."
 - i. Because Jesus our "<u>high priest</u>" is in Heaven, we should be encouraged to "<u>hold fast our profession</u>" as Christians.
 - ii. <u>If He made it to Heaven, then so can we</u>! (Heb. 6:17-20; Heb. 10:11-23; Heb. 12:1-3)
 - B. As our "<u>high priest</u>", He can be "<u>touched with the feelings of our</u> <u>infirmities</u>."
 - i. He was "<u>tempted in all points like as we are</u>." (Mt. 4:1-11; Heb. 2:14-18; hunger, thirst, anger, etc.)
 - ii. And yet Jesus was "<u>without sin</u>." (2 Cor. 5:21; Heb. 9:11-14; Heb. 7:21-26, 17-19)
 - iii. He therefore is our "perfect high priest & our Savior!" (Heb. 5:1-10; Heb. 9:24-28; Jn. 3:16-17)
- II. APPROACHING GOD'S THRONE OF GRACE?
 - A. It is because of all these things that we have said already, that we can "<u>approach God's throne of grace with boldness</u>." (Heb. 4:16; NASV "confidence")
 - i. It is called the "<u>throne of grace</u>" because "<u>all grace comes</u> <u>from Almighty God</u>!" (1 Pet. 5:10; Acts 20:32; Jms. 4:6; Titus 2:11)
 - ii. Jesus was "<u>God's ultimate gift of grace</u>!" (2 Cor. 9:15; Rom. 5:6-8; Jn. 1:17)
 - B. Look at what we can receive when we "approach God's throne of grace."
 - i. We can "<u>obtain mercy</u>." (Ps. 136; 1st Tim. 1:13-16; Phil. 2:25-30
 - ii. And we can "find grace to help in time of need." (2 Cor. 12:7-10; Acts 20:32; 2 Tim. 2:1)

- A. What a wonderful blessing it is to have "<u>Christ as our high priest</u>!" (Heb. 10:21-23; Heb. 6:10-20)
